

**SASKATOON AIRPORT AUTHORITY
2026 SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES**

LANDING FEES:

All landing fees are assessed against jet or turboprop aircraft at a rate per 1000 kgs or fraction thereof.
Minimum flight landing charge for non-airline jet or turboprop engine: \$13.00

Effective March 1, 2026 the following Landing Fees will increase by 4.0% as indicated below:

GENERAL TERMINAL FEES / BORDER CLEARANCE FEES:

General Terminal fees are a per arrival charge for using the terminal facility and for the use of a loading bridge and the apron parking area for a period not to exceed 90 minutes. An additional Border Clearance Fee is charged to all non-domestic arrivals for using the dedicated Customs area. Both fees are based on the seating capacity of the aircraft.

Effective March 1, 2026 the General Terminal Fees and the Border Clearance Fees will increase by 5.0% as indicated below:

AIRCRAFT PARKING FEES:

Aircraft parking fees are assessed based on aircraft weight and on the length of stay. No minimum stay is required. Aircraft arriving that depart within the allotted 90-minute connection time will not be assessed a parking charge.

Aircraft Parking Fees will remain unchanged effective March 1, 2026 as indicated below:

AIRPORT IMPROVEMENT FEE (AIF)

AIF will remain unchanged effective March 1, 2026 as indicated below

*The airline handling fee for signatory airlines is 4%.

AIRPORT IMPROVEMENT LEVY (AIL)

Effective March 1, 2026

For those jet and turboprop driven aircraft whose departure will be exempt from having passengers subject to the Airport Improvement Fee ("AIF") there is an Airport Infrastructure Levy ("AIL"). **Effective March 1, 2026 the AIL will remain at \$0.63 per seat multiplied by the seating capacity of the aircraft.** The seating capacity of the aircraft is to be determined based upon the general design configuration for the aircraft, if available or based upon a ratio of 2.5 seats per 1000 kg MTOW for those aircraft not generally configured for passenger traffic.

VARIOUS CHARGES AND FEES:

1. MOBILE REFUELLER REGISTRATIONS:

\$0.033 per kilogram x gross vehicle weight in kilograms

2. CONCESSION FEE FOR FUEL & OIL DISPENSED BY FBOS:

\$0.10 per liter for AvGas

\$0.02 per liter for Oil

3. INTEREST ON OVERDUE ACCOUNTS

Interest is charged on all overdue accounts after 60 days at a rate of 1.5% per month or 18% per annum

4. GLYCOL COST RECOVERY

Out of pocket costs incurred by the Saskatoon Airport Authority relative to the application of glycol by Airlines at the Saskatoon Airport will be recovered from the Airlines on a prorated basis based upon the reported glycol volumes applied.

5. SECURITY ACCESS FEE

A monthly fee of \$5.00 will be assessed for each individual requiring access privileges to the secure area of the airport. The fee will be charged to the representative Company or Individual who authorized the issuance of the secure area access privileges.

LAND RENTAL:

Land rental costs are comprised of land rent and recovery of airport maintenance costs.
